Attended Executive Committee meeting 10:30 a.m. which covered all items on the agenda but with few requirements for us.

ITEM I

Mr. Black spoke to this item which dealt with his letter to Mr. Shoemaker that was circulated to Committee Members.

Shoemaker indicated that he had received correspondence from Mr. Craven regarding his presentation to the previous meeting.

Shoemaker/Finn, spoke concerning revisions to CHRA and also spoke briefly about SPUR. This just commenced when Finn transgressed into a general dissertation regarding the "black" appearance of the Federal Government scene as it appears today. He continued, stating that it appears almost impossible to get any touchy security legislation before Cabinet, or Ministers, and that Committee Members would be better off

The Chairman spoke to Item I from previous minutes and advised that he had sent a letter to the Commissioner ten days ago asking that I chair a sub-committee of SAC to address the problem of VIP protection. On returning to "HQ" from lunch, I spoke briefly to the Deputy and he advised that he had not seen any such letter, questioned that it would have been sent ten days ago as the subject was on the agenda for the weekly meeting with the Minister but that he would endeavour to establish whether the letter in question had arrived at "HQ".

ITEM IV

Review page by page the draft Bulgarian intelligence

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service document and there were very few corrections or comments. I penciled in the suggested corrections and we should expect the final draft very shortly.

Finn asked what was being done about all the completed papers as a rap up and it was stated that there would be a composite of major issues completed and this document would be supplied to not only the Executive Committee but all departments in general. The suggestion was made that the classification would be downgraded and it would probably come out at the confidential level.

ITEM V

Mr. Lemieux's document was discussed generally and was not accepted by either DND, External Affairs and the Force. General comments were made about inaccuracy of statistics by DND, security screening by Security Service

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and problems relating directly to SPUR by myself and External Affairs. Finn asked that written comments be made to Mr. Shoemaker who could then supply Mr. Finn with a composite reply.

There should be two responses from the Force. One would be from Supt. Friend and I advised that a second would go directly to Mr. Shoemaker from C/Supt. Fedor, Chairman of SPUR.

ITEM VI

The Pitfield letter to Shoemaker was touched on briefly and it was suggested that any department wishing to reply should direct their reply to Mr. Shoemaker.

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OTHER NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Finn asked whether it would be useful for the Executive Committee of SAC to look at the general implications of the SPUR document, Mr. Shoemaker indicated that he would rather look at SPUR in relation to other documents presently being examined, i.e. Gibson's documents, administrative sanctions, Official Secrets Act, security clearances. At this point, Shoemaker advised that Fedor's Committee had completed 98.5% of the SPUR requirements and that he would be dealing with the balance through Pat Ansell.
