REVISION OF ANNEXE TO SECURITY PANEL DOCUMENT SP- 191

Sub-paragraph 2(f) and paragraphs 3 and 4 to be deleted and replaced with the following:

3. It also remains an essential of Canadian security policy that,

- (a) a person who is unreliable, not because he is disloyal, but because of defects in his character which may lead to indiscretion or dishonesty, or make him a likely subject of blackmail;
- (b) a person who, through familial or other close continuing relationship with persons whom he may be presumed to know are persons as described in paragraphs 2(a) to (e) above, may be induced, either knowingly or unknowingly, to act in a manner prejudicial to the safety and interest of the State; and
- (c) a person who, though in no sense disloyal or unreliable, is bound by close ties of blood or affection to persons living within the borders of unfriendly foreign powers and who therefore may be subjected to intolerable pressures;

may not be permitted to have access to classified information, unless after careful consideration of the circumstances, including the value of his services, it is judged that the security risk involved appears to be justified. It is also to be noted that persons described in sub-paragraph (a) above may be unsuitable for employment on grounds other than security.
