Interrogations and statements

AIM

1. To stress the necessity for compliance with the interrogation techniques described in Chapter VIII of CAMT 10-5 when taking statements from soldiers suspected of military or criminal offences. BACKGROUND

- This office has been advised that a C Pro C investigator using the "aplit pair" technique described in para 13 of Chapter VIII, CAMT 10-5, confronted one suspect with a false written statement which he of this false statement a confession was obtained which implicated the suspect and resulted in his conviction.
- 3. While the end result, 1s, the conviction of the offender, may have been as able, and without attempting to interfere with the investigation successfully, this procedure was incorrect and illegal. Although the Judges' Rules allow the presentation to an offender of a with a FAISS statement purported to have been made by an accomplice.

- i. Enquiries by C Pro C investigators will be restricted to facts or natural deductions from facts which have been obtained as presented to suspects under interrogation as actual statements be by accomplices, even if it is considered that this procedure may result in a confession.
- 5. The idea must be firmly fixed in each C Pro C investigator's mind that although certain expedients are recognized in the securing of a confession from an accused or a suspect as soldiers C Pro C and to V 1. of that locally cover all the points which apply to the taking of valid statements from vitnasses, suspects and accused persons.
