1. On 19 OCT 59, acting on instructions of the Area Provost Marshal, Calgary Garrison, an investigation was started into an alleged indecent sexual relationship between [redacted] of [redacted] Alberta Military Hospital, Carrie Barracks, [redacted] employed by the [redacted] and [redacted] both of SON of C Depot, Carrie Barracks, CALGARY, Alberta.

2. Information obtained from the Calgary City police revealed that on 4 OCT 59, [redacted] had complained to them that [redacted] had committed an indecent act with them. Their investigation revealed that these soldiers had accompanied [redacted] to his residence where the three of them had gone to bed naked. [redacted] had gone to sleep; a little later they awoke and found [redacted] committing an indecent act on them using both hands. [redacted] and [redacted] had then gone into the washroom where [redacted] performed another indecent act on him. [redacted] was charged under Sec 149 of the Criminal Code, but later the charge was withdrawn due to the fact that the Crown Prosecutor felt that all parties were equally guilty and that he could not effectively use the evidence of one accused against the other. 3. At about 0855 hrs, 20 OCT 59, accompanied by SN 109271 L cpl FEDORCHUK, Roy, Calgary Provost Sub Detachment, I interviewed [redacted]. He said that on the 3 OCT 59, he and [redacted] had met [redacted] in the St REGIS Hotel, CALGARY, Alta. They had accompanied him to his residence when after having a few beers they had gone to bed. Later [redacted] had been awakened by [redacted] touching his privates. [redacted] then handled [redacted]'s privates, after this they both went into the washroom where [redacted] had performed an act of fellatio on [redacted]. During the interview [redacted] appeared to be telling the truth and left the impression that he became involved with [redacted] through curiosity. See Annex 2.

4. At about 1115 hrs, 20 OCT 59, accompanied by L cpl FEDORCHUK, I interviewed [redacted] who confirmed [redacted]'s statement. He said that he and [redacted] had met [redacted] and gone to his home where the events mentioned in [redacted]'s statement had taken place. [redacted] stated that he and [redacted] had a discussion before they met [redacted] to the effect that if they ever met a queer they would rob him. He claimed that this was his intention when he accompanied [redacted] to his home. He added that he did steal about five dollars from [redacted]'s pocket and that [redacted] had recovered it. See Annex 3. During this interview [redacted] maintained that he had never had indecent sexual relationships with anyone and [redacted] stated that this was the first time [redacted] had.

5. At about 1445 hrs 21 OCT 59, I obtained a statement from [redacted]. He confirmed [redacted]'s statement regarding the theft of the money. He also confirmed that he had handled [redacted]'s and [redacted]'s privates, but denied committing an act of fellatio. He claimed that he had ejaculated. See Annex 4.

6. In conclusion the following points are brought out:

- (a) [redacted] and [redacted] had an indecent sexual relationship.
- (b) [redacted] stole Five Dollars from [redacted]
- (c) Due to lack of outside evidence the charge against [redacted] was withdrawn.

7. As no further action is deemed necessary this file will be considered concluded unless otherwise instructed.
