I found these extremely interesting & useful to read. I am particularly impressed by two aspects of the U.S. approach: the much greater frankness than we display & the apparent use of better trained (educated) people for investigation. It seems to me that there are two lines we ought to look into further.


Some sort of "test" for homosexuals may be proper, but we will have to be careful. This country has a healthy scepticism about "gimmicks" in the area of "justice" and "human rights". I think the polygraph is out. Jaeger!
