1 On the 20 Jun 68, WAIW covering letter W1110-1-05 dated 20 Jun 68 with a copy of RSIV report W1110-3-05 dated 21 Jun 68 attached were received at this detachment. This report stated that S4551 [redacted] [redacted] under Tech, presently at RCAF Stn Fonthal Mountain was suspected of homosexuality while stationed at RCAF Stn Rockcliffe. The OO WAIW instructed this office to interview the subject with respect to this allegation and ascertain from him if other service personnel were involved.

2 This date, S4105 [redacted] was told of the information obtained by RSIV and permission was granted for [redacted] to be interviewed.

3 [redacted] was interviewed by the writer and the security implications relating to homosexuality were pointed out to him. He then stated that he was not a homosexual and that he had never participated in a homosexual relationship. He further advised that he had no knowledge of other airmen having been involved in homosexuality during his service at Stn Rockcliffe. This airman admitted that he had associated with [redacted], reference paragraph 11 of RSIV report, and he believed that they were in the Complex Lounge located in the Airmen's Club on the 2 Apr 68, but he was not certain of this date. Both airmen were sitting on the couch talking and [redacted] had placed his arm behind [redacted] so that it was resting on the back of the couch. The Ordinary Corporal, whose name was unknown but he is called [redacted], then entered the lounge and upon observing these airmen, accused himself and after directing certain remarks to them, he departed. [redacted] stated that he and [redacted] were not embracing each other or kissing when the Ordinary Corporal had come into the lounge. He admitted that their topic of discussion while sitting in the lounge was sex and that [redacted] was describing to him how to fondle women, how to place the hand on the inner sexual organs of a female and the various actions that may be used to excite a woman. [redacted] was unable to state if there were other personnel present in the lounge at this time and when the Ordinary Corporal had left, [redacted] wanted [redacted] to accompany him to Hall, Pt, but this airman returned to his barracks and went to bed. [redacted] stated that he was suspicious of Treashley as he felt that he may have been a homosexual but he could offer no information which would tend to support this view. He said that during the evening that they were in the lounge, he had a feeling that [redacted] was waiting for him to openly state that he was a homosexual. [redacted] had never discussed homosexuality with [redacted] and he had never asked this airman to commit a homosexual act with him. [redacted] advised that it has been his experience that the airmen living in barracks find the subject of homosexuality to be humorous and they are always joking and accusing each other of being a homosexual.

himself was subjected to a great deal of teasing while living in quarters at Stn Southcliffe as apparently certain personnel had the impression that he was a homosexual. This airmen admitted that he had made certain statements and he recalled making the statement that he has had a homosexual problem since he was 12 years of age. These statements were made in a joking manner when the other personnel were teasing him and this airmen had not intended that these comments be taken seriously. Commandant said that [redacted], reference paragraph 14 of LIIU report, had often teased him about being a homosexual in the presence of other airmen and he had made comments like "lets go to bed" and "my you must have a beautiful penis" or words to this effect. Reid would frequently attempt to touch the subject's genitals in a playful manner and [redacted] eventually told him to stop this practice. This airmen felt that [redacted] had behaved in this manner in order to embarrass him and so he had pretended that he was a homosexual as he thought that this would embarrass Reid. [redacted] advised that [redacted] had approached him prior to the date of his departure for Puntal Mountain and requested to know if he was a homosexual. He said that [redacted] had offered to help him, however he was not certain that this airmen was serious or if he was just curious, so he admitted ([redacted]'s own phrase) to him that he was a homosexual. LIIU [redacted] was not known to be a homosexual or to have abnormal tendencies.

4 During this interview, [redacted] mentioned that sometime between Jan - Apr 65, he and his room mate at Stn Southcliffe, [redacted] Radar Tech. now at Stn LeChar, were preparing for bed one evening and while [redacted] was sitting at a table in the mess, [redacted] approached him from the rear and placed both of his hands on the subject's shoulders. [redacted] then stood up and asked if this was a big act and [redacted] said this was not a big act or words to this effect and he apologized. Both airmen then went to bed and the incident was not reported as [redacted] was scared and he thought that [redacted] would be angry with him. He stated that in Nov 65, two civilian homosexuals had approached him when he was on leave in Montreal from [redacted] and he had refused to associate with them.

5 At the conclusion of this interview, the subject was asked if he wished to make a written statement. [redacted] stated that he would and his statement is attached as Appendix A. At the time of writing his statement the subject had not admitted to being a homosexual or having committed a homosexual act. He then admitted in his statement that he had a relationship with a civilian. As disciplinary action is not normally taken against those having committed homosexuality, the caution was not administered to him so that more complete details could be obtained of his relationship with this civilian and details of any other airmen who might be involved.

6 [redacted] stated that he had met a civilian named [redacted], surname unknown, in Central Station, Montreal, while on leave during Nov 65. This civilian had approached him and requested information about the train. He informed this airmen that he was from Windsor and he was on a leave of absence from his company. The subject had mentioned that he had no place to stay that evening and this civilian invited him to spend the night at his place of residence. [redacted] accepted and they went to this man's room which was located on a side street off St Catherine. This man produced an expensive book that contained classic art pictures of nude sculptures and nude paintings. They then proceeded to undress for bed when [redacted] became suspicious as this civilian had left his shirt on and this airmen wanted to leave at this time but he remained. [redacted] stated that he awoke the next morning and this civilian was lying close to him with an erection. He then reached over and manually manipulated this civilian's penis for a few minutes then ceased. This man became aggressive and the subject was required to fight him off. This civilian then wanted to place his penis in [redacted]'s mouth and when the subject refused, this airmen was asked to place his penis in the man's mouth and again he refused.


_____ stated that he was detained in this room for approximately one hour before he was allowed to leave. This man had admitted to him that he was a homosexual and this airman was unable to explain the reason for his actions, but he indicated that it was not his intention to have become involved in a homosexual relationship.

7 The subject was questioned next thoroughly about other airmen that may be homosexuals and he stated that he was told that _____ formerly on strength at Stn Rockcliffe, had been released for being a homosexual. He further stated that two airmen named _____ names unknown, were also released for being homosexuals when he was at Stn Leithers.

8 The CO Stn Pantel Mountain was informed of the results of this interview. He requested that no limited surveillance be made at this time as he wished to await for the medical reports before any further appropriate action is taken in this matter.

9 In view of the information contained in this report, may it be suggested that the reports forwarded to Stn Pantel Mountain be addressed personally to the Commanding Officer.


10 This investigation is being concluded at this detachment and should further investigative action be required, this file will be re-opened.
