1 Reference is made to our ADE 110-1-65 dated the 22 Sep 65.

2 The result of the blood alcohol test has been received and it shows that [redacted] had an alcohol content of 1.5 mg/ml. The blood alcohol test of the German was also received and shows that he had an alcohol content of 1.86 mg/ml. Both certificates are being held on file.

3 Attached as Appendix "A" are the statements of [redacted] briefing NCO, [redacted] SSG Commander, and [redacted] SSG team member, [redacted] briefed the team regarding their duties which included being confined to the Wing and the non-consumption of alcohol. [redacted] was present at the briefing and stated that [redacted] was attendante. [redacted] went to sleep in SSG quarters at 23 hrs 18 Sep 65 and woke up at 0700 hrs 19 Sep 65. He noted that [redacted] had not slept in his bunk which was below [redacted].

4 At 1045 hrs 23 Sep 65, the writer together with Wing Police Officer, 138994 P/O Eric Arthur POND, re-interviewed [redacted]. It was explained to [redacted] that the prime interest was in the security aspect of the case and any possible leads he could give concerning himself or any other personnel who may have been involved before with [redacted]. During the course of the interview, [redacted] denied most strongly that he had ever been involved before in any way, act prior to this occasion. He further stated that although he had known [redacted] for approximately three months as one of the bartenders of the Kegel Keller, he had had no previous association with him nor did he know of anyone else who had been involved. [redacted] was unable to say definitely whether it was he or [redacted] who had suggested they return to the Wing but presumed it was he [redacted] as he wanted to get some [redacted].

5 As a result of the interview it would appear that the decision to leave the Wing was a sudden urge on [redacted] part. Once he had started to drink he realized that he was no condition to return to the Wing and as a result became involved in a situation out of his depth, aggravated by his drinking which caused him to lose all perspective of right or wrong.

6 The listing of names and addresses of persons found among [redacted] personal effects, as referred to in paragraph [redacted] of our last report, has now been completed and is attached as Appendix "B" to this report.

7 On 1 Oct 65, the subject was released to open custody under the observation of the SMO on the authority of the CMO.

8 On the 4 Oct 65, [redacted] appeared before the Commanding Officer charged with the following offences:

- (a) An act to the prejudice of good order and discipline in contravening orders not to leave the Wing whilst on duty contrary to NDA section 118.
- (b) An act to the prejudice of good order and discipline in that he brought a German National onto the Wing without registering him as per para 2, Appendix "H" of Station Standing Orders contrary to NDA 118, and
- (c) Drunkenness on duty contrary to NDA 88.

At this time the Commanding Officer recommended trial by Court Martial.

9 This case is still under consideration at this Wing and a further report will be submitted on conclusion or to meet the noted diary date.
