Andy	<p>1. I have discussed the attached SIU report with DPLS concerning your problem at St Jean. There is no problem in releasing the female recruits who have admitted homosexuality; they can be released under 5(d) with our approval.</p> <p>2. The NCOs with more than 10 years service are another matter. According to our HQ instructions, the CO and command recommendations, <u>together with psychiatric reports</u>, are passed to the Surg Gen's office and to DPLS for assessment. Based upon their advice, a decision is then made concerning release or retention. Because of the changing mores in Canadian society it will be important that we are careful in their case. So, before we make a decision on the NCOs, we will need psychiatric reports or your statement that the individuals refused to undergo psychiatric examination, so that Surg Gen and DPLS are in a position to make knowledgeable judgment.
