CASES INVOLVING SEXUAL ABNORMALITY PROCEDURES

Reference: A. CPCSA OPM Item 114.2

- 1. Recently we have experienced a number of complaints from unit COs and Base Commanders concerning what appears to them to be an inordinate delay from the time the member is identified or admits to being sexually abnormal and the time he is released. In particular the small radar stations with their cloistered society and the Combat Arms units are most reluctant to have the member around any longer than is absolutely necessary.
- 2. A number of suggestions have been presented as possible methods for either expediting the release or getting the member away from the community. For example:
  - a. In cases where the member freely admits to his actions, the Base Commander could release him  $5\text{d}_{\bullet}$
  - b. In the case where the member does not admit to this behavior, would the opinions of the Base Surgeon and the Command AJAG be considered sufficient basis upon which the CO or BComd could authorize a 5d release.
  - c. Is the police report an absolute necessity in all cases?
  - d. Would there be grounds for sending the member on LWOP prior to BSurg and AJAG opinions or subsequent to these opinions?
- 3. Your views on the foregoing would be appreciated and comments should be forwarded to DPCAOR 4 by 15 July 78.
