Background

1. [REDACTED] joined the Canadian Forces [REDACTED]. She was posted to NAVFAC [REDACTED] 31 Jul 89.
2. The United States Naval Investigation Service (NIS) have completed an investigation as a result of a formal complaint of lesbian relationship activity involving [REDACTED] and two or more USN female sailors (FLAG B). To date [REDACTED] has been uncooperative with the NIS and denies any involvement (REF C).
3. The NIS have concluded, with the aid of a reliable witness, that there is very little doubt of [REDACTED] involvement and therefore she has been denied access to the [REDACTED] effective 5 Jun 90. (FLAG B)

Current Situation

4. [REDACTED], upon the request of the USN, has been repatriated to Canada; attach posted to [REDACTED] until completion of the USN trial where Cotes may be required to testify as a witness.
5. Upon completion of the USN trial, approximately 22 June 90, it is intended to post [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] awaiting the results of an investigation by Canadian Authorities. Should she be found suitable for unrestricted employment as an Ocean Op by retaining her security clearance, it is intended to post her to [REDACTED].
