MEMORANDUM TO THE SECURITY PANEL

Quarterly Report on Security Cases

In accordance with paragraph 17 of Cabinet Directive No. 29 of December 21st, 1955, "Security Screening of Government Employees", departments and agencies have submitted the numbers of cases upon which action was taken on security grounds during the first quarter of 1956, and have indicated the kind of action taken. Figures are not yet available from the Department of National Defence or from the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation.

2. The figures submitted have been related to the numbers of requests made to the R.C.M. Police for investigation, and to the number of adverse reports sent by the Police to departments and agencies. The results are as follows:

Of 3,835 requests, 88 reports or 2.03% were adverse;

Of these 88 cases, 48 or 54.5% were acted upon;

Of the total 3,835 cases investigated, 48 or 1.25% were acted upon;

Of the 48 cases acted upon, the action was as follows:

- (a) Dismissed - 1, on grounds of unreliability;
- (b) Permitted to resign - 1, on grounds of unreliability,

- (c) Transferred to non-sensitive posts - 1, on grounds related to dis-loyalty;
- (d) Denied access to classified information - 7, on grounds related to dis-loyalty;
- (e) Denied employment - 17, on grounds related to dis-loyalty,
20, on grounds of unreliability.
