- 98. The special squad will handle all local investigations with assistance from Headquarters "B" Branch when necessary. For the present the method of handling particular enquiries outside the Ottawa area is determined by considering each on its own merit. Some cases have been passed to Divisions for investigation; others have been done by Headquarters "E" branch investigators.
- ontrol of """ Branch during most of the period under review, a section has now been formed within the framework of "A" Branch to handle all files and attend to related duties. The section is under the supervision of a sergeant with one constable attending to the goutine.
- because of the peculiar requirements of this investigation broader terms of reference are under consideration which will facilitate the carrying out of the investigation and make possible its successful conclusion.
- enquiry is the reliability of homosexuals as sources of information. It has been the Force's experience thus far from sources that their naming of an individual as a homosexual, whether their information was obtained from personal contact, hearsay, or the "homing instinct", is substantially correct.
