Subject at this point indicated that his homosexual activities commenced when he was in University and have continued on a limited basis over the years. He explained this by saying that although he had occasionally submitted to homosexual acts when he was lonely and drinking heavily, he was actually more heterosexual than homosexual. He stated very adamantly that he did not at any time engage in homosexual activities while posted abroad.

There is nothing to indicate that an attempt was ever made to compromise subject during his beriod abroad.
