Dear Inspector Barrette:

I refer to Deputy Commissioner McClellan's letter to Mr. Bryce dated February 14, 1961, R.C.M. Police file G 369-66 (13), concerning the security screening of Dr. F. R. Wake, among others.

Attached are Personal History Forms completed by Dr. Wake. It has now become necessary for us to request that an investigation be conducted in accordance with the standards for S.A. clearance. This requirement is a result of a special research project which Dr. Wake will be undertaking on behalf of the government beginning in the fall of this year. While I appreciate the length of time that S.A. clearances normally take, I hope, in view of the previous investigation conducted in 1961 by the R.C.M. Police at our request, that it will be possible for the file to be completed according to the requisite standard by the beginning of October at the latest.

Dr. Wake has not been able to supply some of the information required in paragraph 13 concerning his step-father and step-brothers. He will, however, make this information

available as soon as he has it, and I attach the partially completed Personal History Form in the hope that the investigation might be initiated while Dr. Wake is obtaining the missing information. I trust that this arrangement will not be unsatisfactory.
