Dear Mr. Fulton:

During our brief conversation in the hall the other day concerning security cases involving human frailties, you indicated your preparedness to meet with the small group of the Security Panel who have been studying this matter for some time. The purpose of this meeting would be to discuss the report prepared for you and the Prime Minister early last year, with a view to discussing it with the Prime Minister at a later meeting.

I would suggest that the meeting be kept to a minimum number of those concerned and include in addition to ourselves, the Under-secretary of State for External Affairs and Mr. Starnes, who have had a lot of experience with these problems, the Commissioner of the R.C.M. Police and such other officer as he wishes to have, the Chairman of the Civil Service Commission and Mr. Pelletier. I would also suggest that Mr. Wall act as secretary, and he would be pleased to make the necessary arrangements if you would be good enough to indicate a time which would be convenient to you.
