Re: Security Screening of Government
Employees - Character Weaknesses

Since the inception of our investigation to identify homosexuals employed in and by the Federal Government there has been a growing and continuing need to train some of our investigators in this somewhat specialized field. One of the methods used has been to provide them with articles, papers and books dealing with the general background of this character weakness; its causes and effects; its moral, sociological and security aspects.

2. We have in the "HQ" Reference Library one copy of "The Report of the Committee on Homosexual Offences and Prostitution - Wolfenden Report", published by Her Majesty's Stationery Office in 1957. This Report is a good example of the changing and conflicting views of society on the legal aspect of this character weakness. For this reason we feel the Report would be of value in the training of our investigators. But one copy is not sufficient to meet our needs.

3. Would you kindly obtain and forward to this Directorate three copies of the "Wolfenden Report" at your earliest convenience.
