1. [redacted] was interviewed by the writer on the 8th and 14th of November, 1963 respectively regarding his knowledge of file subject and members of the Canadian Embassy staff in Moscow U.S.S.R. during the period 1949 to 1952 inclusive, with the following results.

2. Stig WENNERSTROM

[redacted] does not recall the individual at all and had no contact with him however, [redacted] does have in his possession a calling card from Lt/Col. and Madam Stig WENNERSTROM, indicating that he must have met him at some time however, he is unable to recall when or where.

CANADIAN EMBASSY PERSONNEL - MOSCOW - 1949

D.A. STANFIELD

Mrs. K.M. BROWN

Came from Manitoba and attended the University of Manitoba. Was in the Canadian Army during the war and married a Winnipeg girl by the name of Doris, maiden name unknown.

A young career officer from Quebec. A very dedicated type [REDACTED]. Was single when he arrived in Moscow, but was married early in [REDACTED] to a girl from Quebec, name not recalled.

[REDACTED] WATKINS does not recall anything about her character, but is of the opinion that Col. GUIMOND would probably know WENNERSTROM.

W/C W.M. STEPHEN

A bachelor career officer who was believed to have been in the R.C.A.F. during the war and remained in Paris after the war to further his education. Nothing known of his background. Had no apparent weaknesses. [REDACTED] is of the opinion he should know WENNERSTROM.

CARDU - 14

El J.B.C. WATKINS ✓ Can. Embassy Moscow 1949

A bachelor. Formerly a professor at the University of Manitoba. Academic type, did not drink and avoided social aspects of life at the Embassy as much as possible and consequently led a rather lonely life. Was a student of languages and known to have studied the Russian language and Scandinavian languages. Had no apparent weaknesses. *except homosexuality.*

C.J. HUGHES

[REDACTED] employed as accountant, but shown as "Attache" on Embassy roster.

Miss ? BARCLAY (known as Jerry)

[REDACTED] stenographer.

## 6. CANADIAN EMBASSY PERSONNEL - MOSCOW - 1952

[REDACTED] he has no knowledge of the personnel stationed at the Embassy in 1952 with the exception of STANFIELD, BLACK, GUIMOND and POTVIN, all of whom have been reported on earlier in this report.

7. It will be noted [REDACTED] assessments and comments regarding the above individuals are with few exceptions quite general. He has also been unable to supply many additional names of personnel to those listed in Headquarters' memorandum.

8. [REDACTED] was questioned concerning his knowledge of the local staff employed at the Canadian Embassy. He recalled very little about them as they changed frequently. He did recall that the local staff was comprised of:

- 3 male chauffeurs
- 7 female maids
- 1 male messenger
- 1 female launderess.

CARDED - 14

These employees were all obtained through the Russian agency "BURUBIN". The liaison man between "BURUBIN" and the Canadian Embassy was a Greek by the name of [REDACTED] who was [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was of the opinion that [REDACTED] was being "used" by the Russians and his pro-western sentiments were not genuine.

9. The only other member of the local staff [REDACTED] could recall by name was a Russian woman by the name of [REDACTED] who was about fifty years of age and was employed at the Canadian Embassy [REDACTED]

10. Considerable time was spent with [REDACTED] in an effort to elaborate on the above information and refresh his memory and he did furnish a list of all diplomatic personnel stationed at the various foreign embassies and legations in Moscow in 1950, but asked to have it returned. The list has been copied here and a copy is attached in the event it should prove to be of value.
