

This has reference to the discussions which took place at a meeting you attended at the Tri-Service Military Hospital during the evening of September 16th, 1964. You will recall it was generally agreed that, for the present, suitable candidates (MO type) for Dr. Wake's project would be drawn from D.N.D. personnel being discharged for one reason or another.

2. We were recently advised by the Director of Military Intelligence that he will be recommending that Reg.# [REDACTED] a suspected homosexual, be processed out of the army at Camp Gagetown, N.B. on the strength of his conduct and in accordance with current Army Security Regulations. The D.M.I. also advised that although personnel are usually transferred back to Ottawa for discharge, under current regulations and to avoid extra expenses, recommendation will be made to have [REDACTED] processed out at Camp Gagetown. The D.M.I. also asked if the Force wishes to interview [REDACTED] prior to his discharge.

3. We have no intention of interviewing [REDACTED] prior to his discharge, however, it has occurred to us that [REDACTED] would be a suitable candidate for Dr. Wake's project. Therefore you may wish to consider contacting the D.M.I. to determine whether or not [REDACTED] can be returned to Ottawa for medical examination prior to discharge.

4. Since we are holding our reply to the D.M.I. we would appreciate being advised of your decision at your earliest convenience.
