On Wednesday, October 14, 1964, we were advised [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] had contacted Mr. Peter JENNINGS of External Affairs to discuss the death of Mr. W.B.C. WATKINS which had been reported in the Globe and Mail issue 14-10-64. (WATKINS died in Montreal on 12-10-64).

2. During their discussion JENNINGS mentioned that he used to work for WATKINS in Copenhagen. Apparently [REDACTED] wanted to confirm the following facts which he put in the form of questions to JENNINGS:
