RE: John Benjamin WATKINS Inquest

The attached four files with master lists are my response to your request for material relevant to the upcoming WATKINS inquest.

These four volumes were extracted from thirty-four volumes of material which covered the R.C.M.P. investigation of WATKINS. Attached paper (tab #1) lists these files in detail.

I approached this review as a peace officer looking for material that would be useful and enlightening to inquest officials in their deliberations. However, as you will note there are a considerable number of documents that cannot be made public because of national security considerations.

To accomplish the above I extracted material showing the investigation was a legal and proper one for the R.C.M.P. to be investigating. Secondly, material showing the degree of involvement of the Department of External Affairs along with the Prime Minister's awareness of the investigation and in one instance his direction. Thirdly, material relating to WATKIN's health and finally the circumstances of his death.

Material from Supp. A (one volume) has seventeen pieces of interest with ten being classified "NO OBJECTION" and seven classified "OBJECTION". File Supp. A (Vols. 1-3) totalled ninty-four pieces of material with eightyfive being classified "OBJECTION" for various security reasons and ten being classified "NO OBJECTION".

Upon examination you may feel I have erred or been too rigid on the "OBJECTION" side and I would be pleased to reconsider and reexamine any piece that causes either you or members of the Solicitor Generals staff difficulty.

The C/M i/c "J" Operations advises telecommunications material, if required, can be downgraded if the headings and endings are clipped. Additionally it may be possible, in some instances, to change an "OBJECTION" if names can be expunged.

Before I return to "B" Ops. I intend to review the files once more and attempt to chart the exact times the investigators interviewed WATKINS. From my first review it does not appear that the periods he was interviewed were excessive in length.

I could not uncover anything which showed the R.C.M.P. members had acted improperly or contrary to their "Terms of Reference".
